I have looked at the world a bit differently since meeting <u>Dr. Kelly J. Baker</u>. I noticed her on a <u>U.S. Religion blog</u>, and when I read that she was an expert on religion, race, *and zombies*, I invited her out for coffee.

Kelly explained to me how our monsters tell us about a culture. The myths give us boundaries—telling us not to wander out in the woods or into certain neighborhoods.
