When civil rights activist James M Lawson Jr. was expelled from Vanderbilt Divinity School in 1960 for participating in sit-ins in downtown Nashville restaurants, the *Christian Century* provided extensive <u>coverage of the aftermath</u>. The *Century* also covered Vanderbilt Divinity School's creation of the <u>James Lawson Institute for</u> <u>Research and Nonviolent Movements</u> in 2022 in recognition of Lawson's contributions. In 2023, the city of Nashville honored Lawson's legacy by naming a <u>brand new high school</u> in his honor. We join in the celebration of Lawson's ministry and leadership in championing nonviolence and civil rights.
